


Hand Sanitizer

PLACEMENT GUIDE

By providing hand sanitizer in strategic locations and posting educational signage next to dispensers, you can help improve the hand hygiene habits of students and staff.



High Traffic Areas

Where many people visit at same time

- Main entrances and hallways
- Food service areas
- Athletic facilities

PRODUCT RECOMMENDATION

Dispenser stands



High Risk Areas

Where many people visit, but not necessarily all at once

- Outside restrooms
- Media center entrance
- Main office entrance
- Trash collection
- Locker rooms
- Healthcare

Medium – Low Traffic Areas

Where fewer people visit/stay throughout the day

- Classrooms
- Admin offices
- Media center tables





RECOMMENDATION

PRODUCT

Place dispenser stands prominently in high traffic areas to encourage people to sanitize their hands. Stands can be moved throughout the day as needed, for example, at building entrances in the morning and food service areas at lunch.

Smart tip! Consider touch-free dispensers to eliminate major touch points.



Wall hanging dispensers Place wall hanging

dispensers at intervals along traffic paths and in areas with increased risk. This will encourage regular use throughout the day.



Bottles of hand sanitizer

Place 2-4 bottles in each classroom, 1-2 bottles per media center table, and 1 bottle per office desk. This is a sustainable starting point for lower-traffic areas.
