GOJO conducts or arranges training on procedures for purchasing personnel regarding the intent and impact of our commitment to purchase from these businesses.

GOJO maintains records of any business award over \$100K indicating if a Minority, Women Owned, Small or Disadvantaged business was included in the process and information regarding why they may not have been awarded the business.
